## St. Martin de Porres

#### Featured Saint

St. Martin was born in Lima, Peru on December 9, 1579. He had a Spanish father and African mother which was unheard of during his time. His father abandoned him and his mother and aunt left him to be raised by a local barber. He had a childhood marked by extreme poverty, loneliness, ridicule and solitude as he was not welcomed.

Due to being mixed race, he was not allowed to enter religious life. At the age of 15, he was finally accepted as a servant boy for many years, with the Dominican Covenant of the Rosary in Lima. At the age of 24 he became a lay brother.

St. Martin's life emulated his love for God and all of God's gifts.

St. Martin was known for having the virtues needed to carefully and patiently care for the sick, even when it was unpopular or could get him in trouble. He was celebrated for his unconditional love and care of all people, regardless of race or wealth. He took care of everyone, whether they were Spanish royalty or Africans living in poverty. St. Martin didn't care if the person was diseased or considered dirty, he welcomed them, cared for them and treated them with dignity.

We can learn a lot from St. Martin as we heard in First Friday mass in November. We should love everyone regardless of differences, it is how Jesus loved others and how we should too.
