

Dear Kindergarten-Fourth Grade Students and Parents,

Welcome to summertime! We hope you enjoy the heat and the many memories that are sure to be made this summer. As you start to develop your summer routine and plans, we ask that you pencil in a few minutes each day for students to be able to maintain the skills that they have gained over the last school year!

For math (this only applies to grades First-Fourth), we will be using iReady to prevent summer learning loss. We suggest that you spend between 45 minutes to an hour on iReady each week.

For reading, you will be given a Summer Reading Passport and Summer Reading Log. Please encourage your child to earn passport stamps by completing the task on each stamp. Your child should read for at least 10 minutes for each challenge.

The challenges are divided into six different categories:

1. Who: This will challenge students to read to parents, brothers, sisters, pets, stuffed animals, friends, etc.
2. What: This will challenge students to read a variety of reading material and genres (e-books, blogs, journals, magazines, comics, directions, recipes, newspapers, etc.)
3. When: This will challenge students to read at various times throughout the day.
4. Where: This will challenge students to read in different places.
5. Why: This will challenge students to read for different reasons (to learn, find information, to write, to skim, for fun, to improve fluency, etc.)
6. How: This will challenge students to read in different ways (read in bed, while on the beach, in the car, etc.)

Our goal for this activity is for students to have fun. We want summer reading to be flexible, but something that families can do together. Please send the completed Summer Reading Passport and Summer Reading Log back to school in September. We cannot wait to see how many you can complete!

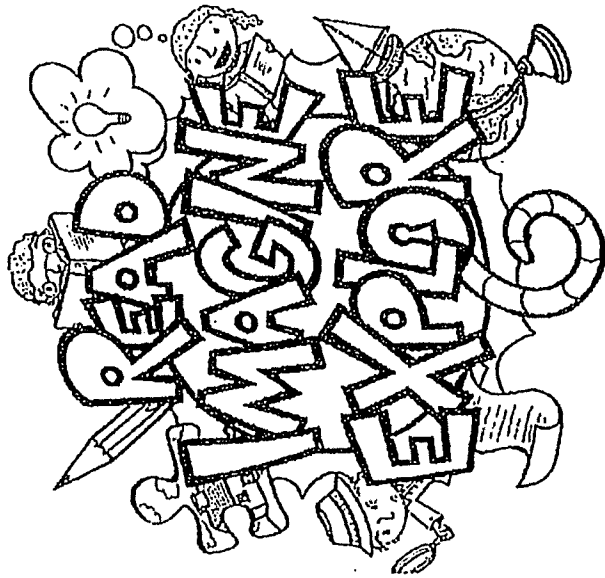
